# Speakers



**Liane Randolph** Chair, California Air Resources Board Liane Randolph is the Chair of the California Air Resources Board. Randolph was previously a Commissioner at the California Public Utilities Commission from 2015 to 2021. She was Deputy Secretary and General Counsel at the California Natural Resources Agency from 2011 to 2014 and an Attorney at Pillsbury, Winthrop, Shaw, Pittman from 2007 to 2011. She served as Chair of the California Fair Political Practices Commission from 2003 to 2007, where she also served as a Staff Attorney from 1996 to 1997. Randolph served as San Leandro City Attorney and was a Principal at Meyers Nave from 2000 to 2003, where she was an Associate from 1997 to 2000. She was an Attorney at Remcho, Johansen and Purcell from 1994 to 1996 and an Associate at Manatt. Phelps and Phillips from 1993 to 1994. She earned a Juris Doctor degree from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Law.

In April 2019, Governor Gavin Newsom appointed Patty Monahan to be one of the five commissioners on the California Energy Commission. She serves in the Energy Commission's Science/Engineering position and is the lead commissioner on transportation. She has dedicated her career toward advancing clean energy technologies and cutting harmful pollution, with a focus on equity. Before joining the Energy Commission, she served as the transportation program director at the Energy Foundation, where she guided campaigns across the United States that advanced electric transportation and more efficient vehicles. She worked for the Union of Concerned Scientists in several roles, including director of the California office and deputy director of clean vehicles. She also worked at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, and several energy-related consulting firms.

Commissioner Monahan received a bachelor of science degree from UC Berkeley and holds a master's degree in energy analysis and policy from the University of Wisconsin, Madison.

#### Kate Gordon

Director, Governor's Office of Planning & Research Kate Gordon has spent the past two decades working at the intersection of climate change, energy policy, and economic development. Gordon was appointed Director of the Governor's Office of Planning and Research and Senior Advisor to the Governor on Climate by Governor Gavin Newsom on January 7, 2019. Trained as a community organizer, and later in law and regional economic development, her focus has long been on bringing diverse groups together to work toward a more sustainable, inclusive economy. Prior to being appointed OPR Director. Gordon was the founding director of the Risky Business Project, which focused on quantifying the economic impacts of climate change on U.S. energy demand, crop yields, and coastal infrastructure as well as on human health and mortality. As part of this work. Gordon consulted numerous investors and corporations on strategies to reduce climate risks across investments and assets, and also served as a co-author on the Fourth National Climate Assessment's chapter on "Reducing Risks Through Adaptation Actions."

Gordon earned a J.D. and a Masters in City and Regional Planning from the University of California-Berkeley, and an undergraduate degree from Wesleyan University. Along with her role in state government, Gordon regularly co-teaches a course at Stanford Law School entitled "Climate: Politics, Finance, and Infrastructure.

**Dr. Joseph K. Lyou** President & CEO, Coalition for Clean Air Dr. Joseph K. Lyou serves as President & CEO of the Coalition for Clean Air. In January 2020 he was appointed to serve on the California Transportation Commission by Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon. Dr. Lyou also served as the governor's appointee to the South Coast Air Quality Management District Governing Board from June 2007 to March 2019.

Prior to his work at CCA, he founded the California Environmental Rights Alliance, a public interest group dedicated to working on environmental justice issues. Dr. Lyou has spent 30 years helping community groups and concerned individuals with environmental protection issues, including air and water pollution, the clean-up of contaminated sites, and environmental justice. He previously held management positions with the California League of Conservation Voters Education Fund and Committee to Bridge the Gap. Dr. Lyou received his Ph.D. from UC Santa Cruz in 1990.

Bill Magavern joined CCA in 2012 and serves as Policy Director, based in Sacramento. He has authored numerous reports and articles on energy and environmental issues, and testifies frequently before the State Legislature. Air Resources Board, and other agencies. An environmental advocate since 1988, Magavern worked as Staff Attorney for the U.S. Public Interest Research Group. Director of Public Citizen's Critical Mass Energy Project. Sacramento Director of the Committee to Bridge the Gap, and Director of Sierra Club California. Bill received his A.B in American Civilization. magna cum laude, Phi Beta Kappa, from Brown University and his J.D. magna cum laude, from the State University of New York at Buffalo Law School.

# What We Do

Our work brings together policy-makers, business leaders and advocates to find cooperative solutions to California's most pressing air quality issues. Despite our many victories, our work is not done. Nine out of ten Californians breathe air that violates federal health standards. We look forward to the day no one has to breathe dirty, polluted air.

#### **Recent Accomplishments**

Your support makes our work possible. Together we recently accomplished the following clean air advances:

- Adoption by CARB of the advanced clean trucks rule, the truck omnibus rule and the ships-at-berth rule. Together, these measures are expected to save over 4,000 lives and \$40 billion in health costs.
- Enactment of SB 210 (Leyva, 2019), which will reduce toxic diesel exhaust by establishing inspection and maintenance requirements for trucks, similar to the SmogCheck for cars.
- Issuance of Governor Newsom's Executive Order requiring a transition to non-polluting cars, trucks and off-road engines.
- Passage by Long Beach voters of Measure US (2020), which will help address historic inequity and environmental degradation by adding a new tax on each barrel of oil produced within city limits.
- Enactment and implementation of **AB 1550** (Gomez, 2016) and **SB 535** (De León, 2012), which ensure that climate investments go to disadvantaged communities.
- Passage of AB 841 (Ting, 2020), which will use idle energy efficiency funds to install and modernize school HVAC systems and streamline the process for approving public electric vehicle charger projects.
- Establishment of **CLEAR**, a network of over 300 air quality monitors that make air quality personal by showing it at the neighborhood scale in real time.
- Enactment and implementation of SB 1275 (De León, 2014) which established the Charge Ahead California Initiative to put one million electric vehicles on California roads and ensure that all Californians benefit from the transition to a clean transportation sector.
- Founding and coordination of California Clean Air Day, a multi-faceted campaign that last year grew to over 1.6 million participants from over 500 partner organizations in 2020.

CCA is California's only statewide nonprofit dedicated exclusively to advocating for healthy air.




