This year, however, the California Air Resources Board heard our call and did just that, ending the sale of gas-powered cars in California by 2035!

Now it's time to go after diesel trucks.

While cars are the largest source of greenhouse gas emissions, it is diesel-powered trucks, ships and trains that make our air so dirty that we violate the Clean Air Act and expose people to cancer-causing chemicals throughout the state.

Deadly pollutants like diesel particulate matter contribute to thousands of premature deaths, asthma and COPD. If we are ever going to achieve clean air, we're going to have to deal with them big time; By one estimate, at least 96% of the trucks on our road are diesel.

The good news is that the technology to eliminate cancer-causing diesel exhaust exists and they are getting better every day. That's why the California Air Resources Board followed our advice this year and passed a rule requiring the sale of zero-emission heavy-duty trucks, another first for California.

Now we need to pass stronger regulations to put these technologies on the road. From our work on legislation, to regulatory proceedings, to implementation efforts, we see the opportunity to make that a reality.

We can, for the first time, truly get to clean air. We work in the Capitol, in boardrooms and in the halls of justice to make sure your voice is heard.
